# COVID-19 Has Ushered in Many Changes



As I write, we are seven weeks into the changes ushered in by the COVID-19 pandemic. It seems that we have all lived a lifetime in those weeks. And while much has shifted around us, we at Stewpot are clear about our mission at this time: do everything we can to strengthen the safety net underneath those without adequate food and shelter.

Like all other essential services, our workload has only increased during this crisis. Only now have I had a chance to stop and write about the past seven weeks and tell you about the brave and wonderful people who have raised the bar for the Stewpot ministry.

One of those extraordinary people is a liver transplant surgeon, Dr. Felicitas Koller. With a team of dedicated third year medical students, she quickly developed a grocery delivery system for the senior citizens who frequent our pantry that included "COVID care kits" of toilet paper, paper towers, hand soap, thermometers, hand sanitizer, and medical information.

But that was not all. She then connected us with volunteers from the Mississippi Organ Recovery Agency who engineered hand washing stations for the Community Kitchen and Brumfield Shelter using five gallon buckets and tubing.

With help from New Gethsamene Baptist Church and donors who have given through our Amazon Wish List, our terrific Afterschool Program staff have been delivering home meals and snacks to our kids and teens and their families. With help from the Mississippi Children's Museum, they've also been delivering STEM activities students can do at home.

To accommodate overflow from both Brumfield and Gateway men's shelters, we opened the Opportunity Center for overnight emergency shelter. Crossgates Baptist Church, St. Andrew's Episcopal School, and Why Not Now have provided dinners and dozens of other volunteers have contributed needed items through the OC's Amazon Wish List.

Our Community Kitchen is now staffed with two work crews. Immediately after the Mayor issued shelter-in-place orders,

Thankfully, restaurants that have traditionally supported *Taste of Mississippi*, such as Iron Horse Grill and Beagle Bagel, have sent us food. Together with our partners at Extra Table and the Good Samaritan Center, we have received massive deliveries of food that have been shared with our other partners including Grace House, Our Daily Bread, Gateway Rescue Mission, and Salvation Army.

Your Stewpot staff have worked together tirelessly. They are here day after day, night after night, even with their own personal challenges during this pandemic. No task has been too small or too large. They have jumped into implementing new health protocols, securing needed supplies and delivering what was needed at any moment.

So many donors – new and faithful regulars – have opened their wallets and given generously. We have used these funds to purchase desperately needed supplies for people whose lives have been turned upside down by the pandemic. These extra contributions, the incredible Stewpot staff, wonderful volunteers and new partners have made possible our response to a community of people wounded by the shutdown of jobs and schools.

Every day I wake up grateful for the work that Stewpot is doing right now, and grateful for being right here, right now. Like all of you, I never imagined our community would be faced with this kind of challenge. Some forty years ago, a group of people came together to make sure Jackson could meet the needs of their neighbors. Because of that vision, and the commitment of thousands over the last four decades, we are doing just that in the midst of this pandemic crisis.

Your support of Stewpot makes real the words of sacred Scripture: "For I was hungry and you gave me food...I was a stranger and you invited me in." Thank you for giving us your gifts, your time, your prayers, and your commitment to this ministry in our corner of the world.

Thank you to the countless individuals and businesses who have helped make sure none of Stewpot's services, to our community, have had to go without. Your support is more important than ever to keep our work going.


