TFOOD

- **57,409** meals served in the Community Kitchen
- 9,672 individuals received groceries from the Stewpot Food Pantry
- 70 elderly, ill, and disabled adults were delivered a meal every week day through Stewpot's Meals on Wheels Program

A HOUSING & SHELTER

- 260 women and children sought emergency shelter at Matt's House
- 336 men received emergency shelter at the Billy Brumfield Men's Shelter and 156 men were enrolled in Brumfield's Transitional Program.
- 483 individuals utilized the Opportunity Center Day Shelter for emergency wintertime shelter
- 48 individuals were housed through Stewpot's Housing Assistance Program

🥙 BODY AND SPIRIT

- 20 men and women participated in HeARTworks, Stewpot's art program that recontinued in August 2023
- 147 individuals were assisted with Case Management
- 3,722 individuals received clothing from the Clothing Closet
- 45 individuals were given legal counsel while visiting the Stewpot Legal Clinic (Clinic reopened June 2023)

Opportunity Center Provided 38 Nights of Winter Shelter in 2023

The Opportunity Center Day Shelter, one of Stewpot's fourteen ministries, is a "home base" during the daytime hours for people experiencing homelessness. When temperatures fall below 40 degrees. the shelter transitions into an emergency overnight shelter. Opportunity Center Director, Javonda Stanton, and her staff worked tirelessly during the cold winter months in 2023, providing 483 individuals with overnight shelter. The shelter can accommodate up to 30 individuals overnight and services are offered on a first-come, firstserve basis. For example. during the most recent winter storm in mid-January 2024, the shelter operated 22 hours a day to ensure that our unsheltered neighbors had access to warm shelter and meals.

Transitioning the Opportunity Center to an overnight shelter would not be possible without the support of our community. Thank you to the many individuals and organizations who donate non-perishable food items, warm clothing, and meals to Stewpot each winter.

Six days a week (Monday-Saturday), the Opportunity Center offers laundry service, showers, mail service, and computer and phone access, as well as toiletries, snacks, coffee, and community. Case management is available on-site to connect visitors with resources like housing, employment, mental health services, medical care, and other specific needs.
